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- Board asked a question about the LAMP investment and whether or not a return had been established
  - There were questions about the LAMP contract that is being presented to the board via 4th Sector
- Board asked about funds being raised and the purchase request process
  - Is there a chance that people feel as though funds are raised and they don't get access to make purchases
  - If someone is interested in a fundraiser and it has to do with the band, is the process fair and balanced?
- Explain the process for determining what amount of funds are allocated to specific programs
  - The budget is created by the CEO and finance team ensuring equity
  - Prior to Mrs. Johnson's tenure, a large amount of money was allocated to Athletics
  - Weekly finance meetings are happening between CEO, finance team, and 4th Sector
  - Because of ESSER funds being depleted, Einstein made decisions to stop spending frivolous funds in order to get results;
    Because of the surplus, Einstein will be able to stand strong, even in the absence of ESSER funding. This is a result of the 5 year financial sustainability plan
  - Board chair explains that under his leadership, he has been transparent and working hard to ensure equitable practices
- Board asks if there are measures in place to track funds that are raised/ submitted. Einstein is moving to School Funds online July 1, 2024
- Board asks that the finance department prepare a report, for transparency, to demonstrate the total costs of activities/programs as well as funds raised when applicable.

Public Comment- employee speaks on the measures that are in place to feed students continuously before and after events

- Board asks about the costs of feeding all parade participants
- Board ask to again quantify the purchases and provide full transparency after events

Public Comment - Staff are aware that leadership genuinely cares about the students and will ensure they have all necessary resources

Board asks if there are written policies that all staff are aware of regarding purchase requests.
